

2019 OMAA/OML WEBINAR: FINANCIAL TOOLS AVAILABLE TO MUNICIPALITIES, TO FUND INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENTS

PROGRAM OVERVIEW:

This webinar will describe the financial tools available to cities to fund infrastructure improvements—including bonds, PACE financing, opportunity zones, and public-private partnerships (P3)—, when and how to use and assemble them, identify the potential problems that cities need to be aware of when working with a private partner, and describe how to protect the cities' interests.

PRESENTER: Stephen P. Samuels, Frost Brown Todd LLC

Stephen has been practicing environmental law in Ohio, and regionally, for forty years. He has served as trial counsel in hundreds of cases before the federal and Ohio state courts, the Environmental Review Appeals Commission, and the Reclamation and Oil and Gas Boards of Review; and has provided counsel and representation in myriad matters before USEPA, Ohio EPA, Michigan DEQ, West Virginia DEP, and the Ohio legislature. He assists private and public clients in defending administrative and judicial enforcement proceedings; obtaining and negotiating the terms of permits required by state and federal environmental and natural resource laws; defending and prosecuting private environmental claims; coordinating environmental assessments and environmental audits of property and businesses; preparing real estate purchase contracts, leases and other documents to ensure sound management of environmental risks in purchasing, selling and leasing property, and conducting business. He also assists business owners, cities, developers, inventors, and contractors with the broad spectrum of issues associated with “green” development and business practices.
