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- HB5 PUBLIC OFFICE-STATE AGENCY EFFICIENCY STUDIES** (KUNZE S, KOEHLER K) To allow the Auditor of State to conduct business case studies regarding the efficiency of local public offices and state agencies, to authorize the Auditor of State to establish a shared equipment service agreement program among political subdivisions, and to specify that a political subdivision that uses the loaned equipment has potential liability for its use under the Political Subdivision Tort Liability Law.
Current Status: 6/14/2016 - **SIGNED BY GOVERNOR**; eff. 9/14/16
- HB8 OIL-GAS LAW** (HAGAN C) To revise provisions in the Oil and Gas Law governing unit operation, including requiring unit operation of land for which the Department of Transportation owns the mineral rights, and to specify that the discounted cash flow formula used to value certain producing oil and gas reserves for property tax purposes is the only method for valuing all oil and gas reserves.

- HB9 TAX EXPENDITURE REVIEW COMMITTEE** (BOOSE T) To create a Tax Expenditure Review Committee for the purpose of periodically reviewing existing and proposed tax expenditures.

- HB12 TIF-INCENTIVE DISTRICTS** (BUTLER, JR. J, BURKLEY T) To establish a procedure by which political subdivisions proposing a tax increment financing (TIF) incentive district are required to provide notice to the record owner of each parcel within the proposed incentive district before creating the district, and to permit such owners, under specific conditions, to exclude their parcels from the incentive district by submitting a written response.

- HB13 POLICE-FIRE LEVY REVENUE** (BUTLER, JR. J, BURKLEY T) To require reimbursement of police and fire levy revenue foregone because of the creation of a tax increment financing incentive district.

- HB32 AIRCRAFT-MOTOR FUEL EXCISE TAX** (PERALES R) To subject the receipt of motor fuel used to operate aircraft to the motor fuel excise taxes rather than the sales and use taxes and to require a percentage of motor fuel excise tax revenue to be used for airport improvements.

- HB37 BEER-LIQUOR MARKET PERMIT** (STINZIANO M, DUFFEY M) To allow a person to possess beer or intoxicating liquor on the premises of a market if the beer or intoxicating liquor has been purchased from a D liquor permit holder that is located in the market.
Current Status: 5/31/2016 - **SIGNED BY GOVERNOR**; eff. 8/31/16
- HB42 LOCAL GOVERNMENT FUND** (GERBERRY R, CERA J) To require that, for fiscal year 2016 and each fiscal year thereafter, the Local Government Fund must receive the same proportion of state tax revenue that the Fund received in fiscal year 2005.

- HB46 GOVERNMENT EXPENDITURE DATABASE** (DOVILLA M) To require the Treasurer of State to establish the Ohio State Government Expenditure Database.

- HB47 REFRESHMENT AREAS-OPEN CONTAINER EXEMPTION** (BLESSING III L, DRIEHAUS D) To allow municipal corporations and townships with a population of more than 25,000 to create outdoor refreshment areas, to exempt persons within such an area from the open container law, and to declare an emergency.
Current Status: 4/30/2015 - **SIGNED BY GOVERNOR**; eff. 4/30/15
- HB48 CONCEALED CARRY-MOTOR VEHICLE-ET AL** (MAAG R) To extend to handguns affirmative defenses to a charge of carrying a concealed weapon or having or transporting a firearm in a motor vehicle, and to modify the prohibition against carrying a concealed handgun onto institutions of higher education, places of worship, day-care

facilities, aircraft, certain government facilities, public areas of airport terminals and police stations, and school safety zones.

- HB51** **INDUSTRIAL COMMISSION BUDGET** (HACKETT R) To make appropriations for the Industrial Commission for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017, and to provide authorization and conditions for the operation of Commission programs.
Current Status: 6/30/2015 - **SIGNED BY GOVERNOR**; eff. 6/30/15; certain provisions effective 9/29/15
- HB52** **WORKERS' COMPENSATION BUDGET** (HACKETT R) To make changes to the Workers' Compensation Law, to make appropriations for the Bureau of Workers' Compensation for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017, and to provide authorization and conditions for the operation of the Bureau's programs.
Current Status: 6/30/2015 - **SIGNED BY GOVERNOR**; eff. 6/30/15; certain provisions effective 9/29/15, other dates
- HB53** **TRANSPORTATION BUDGET** (GROSSMAN C) To make appropriations for programs related to transportation and public safety for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017, and to provide authorization and conditions for the operation of those programs; and to amend the version of section 4507.11 of the Revised Code that is scheduled to take effect January 1, 2017, to continue the provisions of this act on and after that effective date.
Current Status: 4/1/2015 - **SIGNED BY GOVERNOR**; eff. 7/1/15; certain provisions effective other dates
- HB56** **PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT-CRIMINAL RECORDS** (SCHURING K, SLESNICK S) To limit the use of criminal records in the hiring and employment practices of public employers.
Current Status: 12/22/2015 - **SIGNED BY GOVERNOR**; eff. 3/23/16
- HB61** **LAKE ERIE FERTILIZER-DREDGING** (BUCHY J, HALL D) To generally prohibit the application of fertilizer or manure in Lake Erie's western basin on frozen ground or saturated soil and during certain weather conditions, to require publicly owned treatment works either to monitor monthly total and dissolved phosphorous or to prepare optimization studies that evaluate their ability to reduce phosphorous, and to prohibit a person, beginning July 1, 2020, from depositing dredged material in Ohio's portion of Lake Erie and its direct tributaries that resulted from harbor or navigation maintenance activities unless authorized to do so by the director of environmental protection.

- HB64** **OPERATING BUDGET** (SMITH R) To make operating appropriations for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017, and to provide authorization and conditions for the operation of state programs.
Current Status: 6/30/2015 - **SIGNED BY GOVERNOR**; eff. 6/30/15; certain provisions effective 9/29/15, other dates
- HB65** **TAX-EXPENDITURE APPRAISAL** (DRIEHAUS D) To provide for the periodic appraisal of the effectiveness of tax expenditures.
Current Status: 3/24/2015 - House Ways and Means, (First Hearing)
- HB71** **TRANSPORTATION CONTRACTS** (ROEGNER K) To prohibit certain indemnity agreements in motor vehicle carrier transportation contracts.
Current Status: 12/22/2015 - **SIGNED BY GOVERNOR**; eff. 3/23/16
- HB72** **ENERGY IMPROVEMENT DISTRICTS** (CONDITT M) To authorize port authorities to create energy special improvement districts for the purpose of developing and implementing plans for special energy improvement projects and to alter the law governing such districts that are governed by a nonprofit corporation.
Current Status: 5/6/2015 - **BILL AMENDED**, House Public Utilities, (Fourth Hearing)
- HB75** **FIREARM STORAGE-MINORS** (PATMON B) To prohibit any person from storing or leaving a firearm in the person's residence unless the firearm is secured in safe storage or rendered inoperable by a tamper-resistant lock or other safety device if the person knows or reasonably should know that a minor is able to gain access to the firearm

and to provide criminal penalties if a minor gains unauthorized access to a firearm not so stored or rendered inoperable.

HB76 **PUBLIC RECORD DEFINITION (PATMON B)** To include in the definition of public record records kept by a police department established by a qualified nonprofit corporation or a campus police department established by a private college or university.

HB77 **CONTRACTOR REGISTRATION (PATMON B)** To require statewide registration of home improvement contractors, to modify the membership of the Ohio Construction Industry Licensing Board, and to make an appropriation.

Current Status: 11/17/2015 - **SUBSTITUTE BILL ACCEPTED**, House Commerce and Labor, (Fifth Hearing)

HB78 **FIREARM TRANSFER-BACKGROUND CHECK (PATMON B)** To prohibit any transfer of a firearm from a person who is not a federally licensed firearms dealer to a person who is not a federally licensed firearms dealer unless the firearm is transferred through a federally licensed firearms dealer, through a state or local law enforcement agency, or pursuant to a specified exception; to require that background checks be conducted when a firearm is transferred through a federally licensed firearms dealer or through a state or local law enforcement agency; and to provide for recordkeeping with respect to information obtained pursuant to such a background check.

HB81 **SPECIAL ELECTIONS (HAMBLEY S)** To eliminate the ability to conduct special elections in February and to require a political subdivision to prepay sixty-five per cent of the estimated cost of a special election.

HB82 **COUNTY-PRISON CONTRACTS (HAMBLEY S)** To permit a county, a group of counties, or a group of counties and municipalities to contract for the private operation and management of a correctional facility that houses felon inmates.

Current Status: 5/13/2015 - House State Government, (Third Hearing)

HB84 **MUNICIPAL TAX-CIVIL ACTIONS (SPRAGUE R, SWEENEY M)** To require civil actions by taxpayers related to municipal income taxes be brought against the municipal corporation imposing the tax rather than the municipal corporation's tax administrator.

Current Status: 3/24/2015 - House Ways and Means, (First Hearing)

HB86 **DISTRACTED DRIVING (GROSSMAN C)** To create the offense of "distracted driving" and to limit its application and prosecution to persons who also commit a moving violation or a vehicular homicide offense at the same time as the distracted driving offense.

Current Status: 6/10/2015 - House Armed Services, Veterans Affairs and Public Safety, (Second Hearing)

HB88 **ELECTRONIC DEVICES-DRIVING (SHEEHY M)** To prohibit the use of an electronic wireless communications device while operating a vehicle in a school zone during hours when children are present outside or in a construction zone during hours of actual work, to specify that the offenses related to the use of a handheld electronic wireless communications device while driving apply to the operation of all vehicles rather than all motor vehicles as under current law, and to make driving a vehicle while using a handheld electronic wireless communications device to write, send, or read a text-based communication a primary rather than secondary traffic offense.

HB90 **TRANSPORTATION NETWORK INSURANCE (HACKETT R, BISHOFF H)** To regulate insurance requirements for transportation network companies and transportation network company drivers.

- HB91** **CEMETERIES-PROPERTY TAX (GREEN D)** To lengthen the maximum term of a property tax levied for the purpose of operating a cemetery.
Current Status: 4/28/2015 - House Ways and Means, (Second Hearing)
- HB101** **HAB MITIGATION (HALL D)** To establish requirements governing the training of employees of publicly owned treatment works and public water systems to monitor and test for harmful algae, the development of emergency plans by certain public water systems to respond to harmful algal blooms, and the development of an early warning system for harmful algal blooms, and to require the Director of Natural Resources to study the impact of certain species on Lake Erie.
Current Status: 3/24/2015 - House Agriculture and Rural Development, (First Hearing)
- HB104** **FRONT-LICENSE PLATE DISPLAY (DEVITIS A)** To specify that failure to display a license plate on the front of a motor vehicle that is required to display a license plate on the front and rear of the vehicle is a secondary traffic offense, to establish a maximum fine of \$25 for such an offense, and to amend the version of section 4503.21 of the Revised Code that is scheduled to take effect January 1, 2017, to continue the provisions of this act on and after that effective date.
Current Status: 2/23/2016 - **REPORTED OUT**, House Armed Services, Veterans Affairs and Public Safety, (Third Hearing)
- HB107** **SPEED-LIMIT REDUCTION REQUEST (STINZIANO M, RETHERFORD W)** To permit a person or neighborhood association or organization to request the Director of Transportation to reduce the speed limit on the street or highway of the person's residence or a street or highway located within the area of representation of the association or organization if the street or highway has a speed limit of not more than 35 miles per hour, and to permit a person or neighborhood association or organization to request the Director or a local authority to erect a stop sign at an intersection where currently no stop sign is present.

- HB115** **MOTORCYCLE TRAFFIC CONTROLLERS (GREEN D, LANDIS A)** To create the motorcycle road guard certificate and training program to allow certified individuals to function as traffic controllers.
Current Status: 4/21/2015 - House Transportation and Infrastructure, (First Hearing)
- HB128** **TAX CREDIT-ENDOWMENT DONATIONS (SEARS B, AMSTUTZ R)** To authorize an income tax credit for donations to the permanent endowment fund of an eligible community foundation and to require the Director of Budget and Management to reimburse the Local Government Fund and the Public Library Fund for revenue lost because of the credit.

- HB130** **PUBLIC RECORDS-DATA BOARD (HAGAN C, DUFFEY M)** To create the DataOhio Board, to specify requirements for posting public records online, to require the Auditor of State to adopt rules regarding a uniform accounting system for public offices, to establish an online catalog of public data at data.Ohio.gov, to establish the Local Government Information Exchange Grant Program, and to make an appropriation.
Current Status: 9/28/2016 - Referred to Committee Senate Finance
- HB132** **CONTRACEPTION COVERAGE-EDUCATION (LEPORE-HAGAN M, BISHOFF H)** Regarding coverage for prescription contraceptive drugs and devices, the provision of certain hospital and pregnancy prevention services for victims of sexual assault, and comprehensive sexual health and sexually transmitted infection education in schools.
Current Status: 4/14/2015 - Referred to Committee House Health and Aging
- HB134** **FORECLOSURES-VACANT PROPERTIES (GROSSMAN C, CURTIN M)** To establish summary actions to foreclose mortgages on vacant and abandoned residential properties, to expedite the foreclosure and transfer of unoccupied, blighted parcels, to make other changes relative to residential foreclosure actions, and to terminate certain provisions of this act on December 31, 2019, by repealing sections of the Revised Code on that date.
Current Status: 5/25/2016 - **BILL AMENDED**, Senate Government Oversight and Reform, (Third Hearing)
- HB144** **METHAMPHETAMINE-PROPERTY REMEDIATION (ANIELSKI M, SYKES E)** To provide for the remediation of real property on which an illegal methamphetamine manufacturing laboratory has been discovered.

Current Status: 4/21/2015 - House Judiciary, (First Hearing)

HB147 **CONCEALED CARRY (HOOD R)** To allow a person who has a concealed handgun license to carry concealed all firearms other than dangerous ordnance or firearms that state or federal law prohibits the person from possessing and to provide that a person 21 years of age or older and not legally prohibited from possessing or receiving a firearm by federal law does not need a concealed handgun license in order to carry or have concealed on the person's person or ready at hand a firearm and is subject to the same laws regarding carrying a concealed firearm as a person who has a concealed handgun license.

HB150 **HOTEL SALES-USE TAX (GROSSMAN C, SCHERER G)** To require hotel intermediaries to collect and remit applicable sales and use tax on the full amount paid for hotel lodging, to require hotel intermediaries to supply customers with itemized invoices, to specify that a hotel intermediary is presumed to have "substantial nexus" with Ohio if the intermediary arranges lodging at Ohio hotels, and to specify that hotels are not liable for the failure of a hotel intermediary to properly collect or remit applicable taxes.

HB152 **CONCEALED CARRY-LICENSING (HOOD R)** To allow a person who has a concealed handgun license to carry concealed all firearms other than dangerous ordnance or firearms that state or federal law prohibits the person from possessing and to provide that a person 21 years of age or older and not legally prohibited from possessing or receiving a firearm by federal law does not need a concealed handgun license in order to carry or have concealed on the person's person or ready at hand a firearm and is subject to the same laws regarding carrying a concealed firearm as a person who has a concealed handgun license.

HB154 **BICYCLE PASSING-TRAFFIC LIGHTS (HENNE M, SHEEHY M)** To provide that when a motor vehicle passes a bicycle the safe passing distance to the left is three feet, and to alter the protocol for proceeding into an intersection that has malfunctioning traffic lights.

HB159 **REAR LICENSE PLATE (JOHNSON T, PATMON B)** To require that motor vehicles carry only one license plate to be displayed on the rear of the vehicle, and to amend the version of section of the Revised Code that is scheduled to take effect January 1, 2017, to continue the provisions of this act on and after that effective date.

HB162 **SEVERANCE TAX RATES (CERA J)** To change the basis, rates, and revenue distribution of the severance tax on oil and gas, to create a grant program to encourage compressed natural gas as a motor vehicle fuel, to authorize an income tax credit for landowners holding an oil or gas royalty interest, and to exclude some oil and gas sale receipts from the commercial activity tax base.

HB166 **LOCAL TAX-FISCAL REVISIONS (GREEN D)** To make changes to the law governing community improvement corporations, the administration of property taxes, and the functions of county auditors.

Current Status: 6/8/2016 - **SIGNED BY GOVERNOR**; eff. 9/8/16

HB176 **GAS-FUEL CONVERSION PROGRAM (HALL D, O'BRIEN S)** To create the Gaseous Fuel Vehicle Conversion Program, to allow a credit against the income or commercial activity tax for the purchase or conversion of an alternative fuel vehicle, to reduce the amount of sales tax due on the purchase or lease of a qualifying electric vehicle by up to \$500, to apply the motor fuel tax to the distribution or sale of compressed natural gas, to authorize a temporary, partial motor fuel tax exemption for sales of compressed natural gas used as motor fuel, and to make an appropriation.

HB178 **LIQUOR PERMIT-FARMERS MARKETS (MANNING N)** To establish the F-10 liquor permit to authorize certain A-2 permit holders to sell Ohio wines at farmers markets.

Current Status: 6/14/2016 - **SIGNED BY GOVERNOR**; eff. 9/14/16

- HB180** **RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS (MAAG R)** To prohibit a public authority from requiring a contractor to employ a certain percentage of individuals from the geographic area of the public authority for the construction or professional design of a public improvement.
Current Status: 5/31/2016 - **SIGNED BY GOVERNOR**; eff. 8/31/16
- HB182** **JOINT ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT DISTRICTS (SCHURING K)** To revise the law governing the creation and operation of joint economic development districts (JEDDs) and enterprise zones, to exempt from property taxation real property owned by a nonprofit organization selected by the Federal Small Business Administration as an intermediary lender in the Federal Microloan Program, to lower the contribution threshold necessary to maintain an income tax refund contribution "check-off" option, to extend the deadline for municipal corporations to report information to enable a computation of fiscal effects of recent changes to net operating loss deductions for municipal income tax purposes, and to modify eligible investment criteria for the state New Markets Tax Credit.
Current Status: 6/13/2016 - **SIGNED BY GOVERNOR**; eff. 9/13/16
- HB187** **FIRST RESPONDERS-INJURED ANIMALS (GINTER T)** To authorize a first responder, emergency medical technician-basic, emergency medical technician-intermediate, emergency medical technician-paramedic, or volunteer firefighter to stabilize an injured animal in an emergency.
Current Status: 5/31/2016 - **SIGNED BY GOVERNOR**; eff. 8/31/16
- HB204** **PEACE OFFICER-BASIC TRAINING (DERICKSON T, MANNING N)** To prohibit the Ohio Peace Officer Training Commission from recommending and the Attorney General from adopting a rule limiting the number of hours of basic training required for peace officers and to generally require all persons newly appointed to a peace officer position to have received a high school diploma or certificate of high school equivalence.
Current Status: 6/24/2015 - Referred to Committee Senate Government Oversight and Reform
- HB205** **SELF-INSURING EMPLOYERS (HENNE M, RETHERFORD W)** To modify the requirements for an employer to become a self-insuring employer for purposes of the Workers' Compensation Law, to transfer authority over the workers' compensation self-insurance program to the Superintendent of Insurance, and to allow certain employers and groups of employers to obtain workers' compensation coverage from a private workers' compensation insurer.
Current Status: 2/9/2016 - House Insurance, (Third Hearing)
- HB207** **WORKERS' COMPENSATION-SURPLUS FUND (HENNE M, MCCOLLEY R)** To allow a state fund employer to have a workers' compensation claim that is likely to be subrogated by a third party paid from the surplus fund account in the state insurance fund rather than charged to the employer's experience.
Current Status: 5/31/2016 - **SIGNED BY GOVERNOR**; eff. 8/31/16
- HB214** **PUBLIC IMPROVEMENT-PIPING MATERIAL (THOMPSON A)** To restrict when a public authority may preference a particular type of piping material for certain public improvements.
Current Status: 5/24/2016 - House Energy and Natural Resources, (Third Hearing)
- HB231** **PROPERTY VALUATION COMPLAINTS (GROSSMAN C, MCCLAIN J)** To require counties, municipal corporations, townships, and school boards that file complaints against the valuation of property they do not own to pass a resolution approving the complaint and specifying the compensation paid to any person retained to represent the county, municipal corporation, township, or school board in the matter of the complaint.
Current Status: 11/17/2015 - House Local Government, (First Hearing)
- HB232** **SELLER-USE TAX COLLECTION (GROSSMAN C, SCHERER G)** To prescribe new criteria for determining whether sellers are presumed to have substantial nexus with Ohio and therefore required to register to collect use tax, to allow sellers presumed to have substantial nexus to rebut that presumption, and to require a person, before the person enters into a sale of goods contract with the state, to register, along with the person's affiliates, to collect use tax.

- HB233** **REDEVELOPMENT DISTRICTS (SCHURING K)** To authorize municipal corporations to create downtown redevelopment districts and innovation districts for the purposes of promoting the rehabilitation of historic buildings, creating jobs, encouraging economic development in commercial and mixed-use areas, and supporting grants and loans to technology-oriented and other businesses.
Current Status: 5/6/2016 - **SIGNED BY GOVERNOR**; eff. 8/5/16

- HB237** **TRANSPORTATION NETWORK COMPANIES** (DUFFEY M, HACKETT R) To regulate transportation network companies and transportation network company services.
Current Status: 12/22/2015 - **SIGNED BY GOVERNOR**; eff. 3/23/16
- HB261** **STATE TRAUMA BOARD** (GROSSMAN C, HUFFMAN S) To establish the State Trauma Board in the Ohio Department of Health, to require that facilities that provide trauma care be designated by the Board as level I, II, or III trauma centers, and to provide that the amendment by this act to section 101.82 of the Revised Code terminates on December 31, 2016.
Current Status: 11/10/2016 - Re-Referred to Committee
- HB262** **MUNICIPALITY-ORDINANCE VIOLATIONS** (STINZIANO M, JOHNSON G) To allow a municipal corporation to request assistance from the Ohio Civil Rights Commission in receiving, investigating, passing upon, and enforcing alleged violations of an ordinance of the municipal corporation that prohibits discrimination and to require the Ohio Civil Rights Commission to provide the assistance if the resources necessary are available.

- HB277** **9-1-1 SYSTEM LEVY** (BRENNER A) To authorize a county, township, or municipal corporation to impose a 9-1-1 system levy in only the portion of the subdivision that would be served by the 9-1-1 system and to declare an emergency.
Current Status: 6/28/2016 - **SIGNED BY GOVERNOR**; eff. 6/28/16
